Children of Addicted Women

The only published work on prenatal methamphetamine exposure in school-age children draws from a series of studies from Sweden examining 66 amphetamine-exposed children who have been studied to the age of 14. 56 At age 4, 57 there were no differences in physical growth or health. Mean IQ was lower than a separately selected control group from the population.

Substance Abuse in Children Prediction, Protection, and Prevention. This study reported that, for the first time in 6 years, marijuana and other illicit drug use was unchanged among eighth-graders; in addition, there was a concurrent increase in disapproval of marijuana use among these students.

Meeting the Special Needs of Drug

Initial findings of an ongoing study that is tracking 300 Chicago-area infants whose mothers used cocaine and possibly other drugs during pregnancy suggest that at three years of age many of the children have language

problems and are easily distracted.

Prenatal Substance Abuse: Short

Prenatal substance abuse continues to be a significant problem in this country and poses important health risks for the developing fetus. The primary care pediatrician's role in addressing prenatal substance exposure includes prevention, identification of exposure, recognition of medical issues for the exposed newborn infant, protection of the infant, and follow-up of the exposed infant.

Parental Drug Use as Child Abuse

do not currently address the issue of children exposed to illegal drug activity. Two areas of concern are the harm caused by prenatal drug exposure and the harm caused to children of any age by exposure to illegal drug activity in their homes or environment.

However, results from the National Household Survey on Drug Abuse (U.S. Department of Health and Human Services [USDHHS], 2001) did not show sex differences in the use of alcohol or marijuana for children 12 to 17 years of age, suggesting that girls' use may increase faster over time relative to boys.
